Some of this funding will carry across to the next academic year. • For those two members, confidence in teaching key skills improved resulting in higher quality PE lessons being delivered across year groups and improved teacher subject expertise. • Up until March 2020 -pupil enthusiasm and motivation improved with greater participation in after school sports clubs including: handball, dance, football, cricket and athletics. • Through this partnerships the school was able to participate in weekly inter-school competitions

Coaches for after school clubs.</p>	<p>£14,190 (£2500 carried over to following year)</p>	<p>Continued/new</p>	<p>All</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • School received the Arts Mark platinum in 2018-29 as a result of the excellence of arts provision, which included the dance coach • As well as usual team teaching, the PE coach was able to work with more of our nursery children this year, providing support at all levels of the school community. This has been an important strategy in beginning to address the relatively high levels of childhood obesity in our community. This will continue to be a focus for next year. • Early morning before school coaching of both boys and girls in football and cricket has led to increased opportunities for engaging in physical activity. The PE coach has targeted inactive children and directly invited certain children to participate in these clubs, with the support of parents. • There has been an increase in girls participation in sports, particularly cricket • PE Coach has delivered whole school INSET to staff as well as team teaching resulting in pupils improving their key skills because of higher quality PE lessons • PE coach continued supporting staff and pupils during the partial reopening of the school and delivered some team teaching to support staff in adapting planning for covid safe lessons. • Since March, the PE coach has supported teachers in planning for activities and PE lessons in the new 'zoned playground' including help with planning and using equipment. • The availability of a wider variety of sports (including dance) has inspired more children to participate in competitive and non-competitive physical activity.

The PE coach and SLT planned a zoned playground and each area of the playground had a specific skill or activity focus. This was not part of the original spending plan. However, this provided an opportunity to develop and focus on new sports such as basketball, badminton, tennis as well as team games. • New resources have excited pupils resulting in greater pupil engagement and participation both in PE lessons and lunchtime activities. • In September 2019, The Fairplay house residential gave 60 children the opportunity to experience a range of unusual outdoor and adventurous activities such as archery, caving, climbing and orienteering, enhancing their life experiences.

However due to Covid, the sessions have been paused until the next academic year. The sports coach will restart the qualification in September. Part of this funding will carry across another year.
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
